## **CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE**

The Morris and Gwendolyn Cafritz Foundation is pleased to report on its grantmaking for fiscal year 2020 – 2021. In 2020, the Foundation awarded \$18.7 million to 385 nonprofits organizations in the Washington metropolitan area.

As you read this year's *Report of Grants*, you will find extraordinary organizations and leaders improving the lives of individuals and creating stronger communities. A wide range of nonprofits are represented, including groups that focus on youth, housing, criminal justice reform, the arts, and the environment. Many grantees work across multiple program areas, sometimes in unexpected ways, demonstrating how both the issues and solutions are interconnected.

The COVID-19 pandemic affected every aspect of daily life. As the virus spread, it magnified the unequal access to services across our region. Soon after schools and businesses closed, the killing of George Floyd in Minneapolis, Minnesota provoked civil unrest at a national level. The ensuing national discourse brought longstanding racial inequities to the forefront, adding to the national health emergency.

Locally, our grantees reacted and adapted to address the complex situation through newly formed partnerships, the creation of new initiatives, and expansion of existing programs. Multifaceted responses spanned across interest areas to provide expanded social and mental health services, caregiving, technology interventions, and equity and racial justice advocacy. Enhanced programs provided food, school and art supplies, rent payments and cash assistance. Nonprofits shared resources such as vans and trucks to help other agencies deliver supplies to quarantined individuals. Emergency funds were set up to pay for internet access, and grocery gift cards were distributed to families with significant financial needs

As the pandemic unfolded, some grantees discovered unexpected opportunities. Clinics and healthcare providers quickly increased telehealth appointments, added specialty care, and developed webinars focused on safety practices. Technology and online platforms connected people to classes, work, legal aid services, art programs and performances. Nonprofits collaborated to train hundreds challenged by technology to utilize online resources. Virtual offerings increased overall access to services by eliminating the preexisting barriers of transportation and childcare. Grantees opened their doors to provide space for students who were without internet access at home so they could attend school virtually, and offered supervision when parents returned to in-person work. For many programs, staff reconnected with past participants, attendance increased, and new audiences were created.

One of the pandemic's less visible yet tangible effects was on the psychological and emotional health of individuals. With added stress, loss and isolation, there was a notable increased demand for mental health programs, including for frontline workers. Health providers delivered caregiving and mental health services in the method deemed most effective for constituents - from assembling "take home kits" when program participants were unable to meet in person, to providing clinical care via telemedicine. To help meet this growing need, organizations unrelated to the health field reached out to their clients and created activities to keep them engaged. Community arts programs reached out to caregivers, veterans, service members and families who were faced with a heightened risk of social isolation, loneliness and adverse mental health concerns. Artists connected with people by telephone for poetry readings and conversations and used virtual platforms for live-streamed performances.

Nonprofits quickly transitioned from inperson to virtual services. Organizations provided phones, iPads, and data plans to people living with a range of mental and behavioral health challenges so they could participate in virtual services, including crisis interventions and suicide prevention programs. Support groups, therapy, fitness classes, book clubs and more were offered via online meeting spaces. Many organizations conducted frequent phone outreach to keep clients involved and engaged, especially as clients lost jobs, had their hours reduced, or worked in essential services where they felt their health was at risk daily.

Academic and youth programs had their own specific challenges to face. Schools sent families regular communications with links to food and other resources and offered emotional support and one-on-one counseling. Advocates offered recommendations to strengthen school-based mental health programs and organized letter-writing campaigns with their peers. These activities raised awareness and contributed to the DC Council's decision to increase school-provided mental health services.

First-time grants were made to organizations assisting parents who were suddenly expected to supervise and manage their child's virtual learning experience while they worked from home. Other first-time grants provided teachers supplementary training to address learning loss and enhanced support for children with disabilities and special needs.

This year's grants included innovative programs for foster families and homeless shelters that came with unexpected commitments, challenges and responsibilities. Toys, games, art supplies, books and activity packets were mailed to families living in shelters, and 'survival guides' for parents were expanded for families confined and challenged by limited access to safe indoor spaces.

The COVID-19 pandemic highlighted a lack of both suitable indoor and outdoor spaces for programs. Parks became more desired places, and the physical and mental health benefits of nature became more pronounced, as did the issue of the limited amount of available accessible green areas.

In lieu of the traditional summer camp schedule, youth organizations responded with a hybrid of online and in-park activities. Parents requested physically active programs, and groups responded with materials and contactless instruction and events. Partnerships between youth organizations, environment groups and food-related nonprofits provided spaces, take-home bags of fresh produce and family-sized meals for participants. Organizations also provided masks, hand sanitizers and information about taking appropriate COVID-19 precautions.

While service delivery shifted to virtual formats whenever possible, programs that provided tangible resources such as food, clothing and medical treatment had to adapt in other ways. Group dining sites switched to meal delivery models or brown bag meals were handed out. Homeless organizations set up outdoor space for counseling, referral services and call-in centers connected clients with volunteer doctors.

The pandemic exposed many challenges facing our society, and the civil unrest of 2020 put a finer point on racial justice issues. Initiatives were designed and created to promote inclusion in the nonprofit sector and address the gap in the number of Black, Indigenous, and other people of color who serve in senior management and leadership roles. For young people, mentoring programs connected and shared firsthand experiences through social media platforms and used one-on-one meetings with coaches to increase involvement. Revised high school curriculums with a particular focus on racial equity were implemented across the DC region. Entrepreneurship and skill-building programs focused on the unique experiences and challenges faced by those historically underrepresented.

Finally, we would like to acknowledge the early partnership of the Weissberg and Harman Family Foundations, which, with The Morris & Gwendolyn Cafritz Foundation, launched the **Arts Forward Fund** at, and staffed by, the Greater Washington Community Foundation. Joined by more than a dozen other funders and individual donors, the Fund provided grants to arts and culture organizations in the DC region during the pandemic. In its first year, artists, community members and the Fund's steering committee collaborated in the review process and approved more than \$1 million in grants for capacitybuilding, training, and innovation to area cultural organizations. More than 60 percent of the grants went to person of color-led and -serving organizations. In response to the significant ongoing need, many of the contributors committed to support a second round of funding in 2021.

Although 2020 – 2021 was a challenging year, we were inspired by so many ingenious, dedicated and tireless nonprofit leaders and staff who restructured organizations, shifted missions, and expanded goals. Both first-time and long-time grantees made a profound difference across the region, from building the capacity of grassroots organizations, to healing communities, to engaging regional leadership to create an accountable and transparent court system, to providing life-saving resources and hope. Pioneering solutions were implemented to serve even more individuals, during the most turbulent of times, and enhanced already remarkable work. Nonprofit organizations delivered their services in extraordinary ways, and the incredible efforts persist as recovery continues. The pandemic uncovered the vulnerabilities and fractures within our society, but it also gave rise to understanding, opportunity, leadership, and partnership.

I would like to thank our dedicated Board of Directors and Advisory Board for their work and advice this past year. I would also like to thank our staff for their work as the landscape changed and our community came together to ensure nonprofit organizations could operate at their best during these extraordinary times.

The Morris and Gwendolyn Cafritz Foundation was incorporated under the laws of the District of Columbia in 1948. The Foundation awards grants only to charitable, educational and cultural institutions exempt from taxation under the Internal Revenue Code. The general policy is to concentrate grants to organizations operating within the Greater Washington Metropolitan Area, with projects of direct assistance to the District of Columbia and its environs. Grants generally are not made for capital purposes, endowments or to individuals. Support for projects will be limited as to time, and it is not the general policy to commit for more than one year at a time.
