CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

The Morris and Gwendolyn Cafritz Foundation is pleased to report on its grantmaking for the fiscal year 2021 – 2022. The Foundation awarded \$21.7 million to 431 nonprofit organizations in the Washington metropolitan area during this period.

The COVID-19 pandemic highlighted the economic and social challenges facing our region. Over the course of the pandemic's second year, the Washington, DC region began to shift from a rapid response mindset to a longer-term recovery approach. The Foundation's grantmaking reflected the dual imperative to support immediate demands while also contribute to the stability and capacity of long-term efforts. The Foundation sought to assist the region as it healed and moved forward.

As such, the Foundation increased the number of first-time grants in 2021-2022 and sustained many tenured programs. Grants were committed to longtime grantees as well as to organizations that resulted from the merging of established nonprofits. While some initiatives and organizations were new grantees to the Foundation, they represent the Foundation's long history of taking risks by supporting those who step forward to respond with ideas and proposals to improve lives in the DC region. These grants confirm our belief in, and respect for, the organizations and people who work each day making this community a better place for everyone.

The mix of new and long-standing grantees contribute to DC's resiliency, bringing in more voices and experiences as we move forward together in this changing world. This year's *Report of Grants* highlights grantees who represent a wide range of efforts -- across the program areas of arts and humanities, community services, health, education and the environment -- to meet the urgency of the moment and continue to build a stronger community for the Washington, DC metropolitan area.

Grantees increasingly focused on building capacity and sustaining programs operated prior to the crisis, while creating plans to permanently support the successful initiatives implemented during the pandemic. As restrictions on in-person gatherings lifted and as organizations realized that expanded technology had changed the landscape, virtual programs were adopted as new ways to engage with their respective clients, students, patrons, and communities.

As the region began to reopen and recover, arts and culture organizations continued to face an uncertain future. In response, the Foundation awarded a leadership grant to enable a second round of collaborative funding through the Arts Forward Fund. Needs included additional technical enhancements, rebuilding staff to support both traditional and hybrid production models, and making capital improvements for safe returns to in-person programming.

To assist reopening plans and to help comprehend the infection pattern, a grant supported the development of a regional online database that tracked the spread of COVID-19 and followed the evolutionary descent of different COVID variants across the region. This multi-jurisdictional tracking system was initiated by local governments and allowed epidemiologists and other public health workers to identify and monitor emerging variants, and conduct contact tracing to prevent further spread.

Access to mental health services was a serious issue for our region prior to the pandemic, and it was amplified with the onset of COVID-19. Mental health providers noted alarming trends, including a significant increase in the number of suicides of young people, and the need for new approaches to serving the community. The Foundation responded with grants to six new grantees focused on mental health services, including specific support for eating disorders, substance abuse, and grief and loss.

Food and nutrition efforts remained critical and grew during the pandemic. The Foundation was pleased to support additional food-focused groups working on access through food donations and distribution through a network of partners. A new grantee mobilized a continuum of food providers and access to supply, while a grant made to a longtime grantee supported the construction of a new kitchen and facility that expanded enrollment in its culinary workforce development program by 150 percent and increased daily food provision from 12,000 to 25,000 nutritious meals for food insecure Washingtonians.

In 2021-2022, the Cafritz Foundation made grants to educational programs addressing the detrimental learning effects of the COVID-19 disruption, including a specific focus on early grade literacy. Grants supported organizations that took on additional responsibilities and families when some childcare centers needed to close their doors. Others took on the additional regulations and staff training needed to provide in-person instruction during the day when schools were closed due to COVID-19.

Areas of needed attention continued to surface beyond the pandemic, including in the areas of justice and climate. The Foundation's criminal justice and legal services grants included first-time support to additional organizations that address violence intervention and conflict resolution, including community-led resolution models. Environment grants were committed to organizations that raised awareness and made environmental issues relatable. A long-time grantee held its first virtual *Climate Crisis Conference* attended by over 400 participants. It hosted dozens of panelists that discussed topics such as citizen engagement, climate justice, resiliency and park access. Several first-time environmental grant recipients focused on leadership, outdoor education, and programs offered through varied media, including film. They moderated conversations that stimulated dialogue, awareness and provided actionable steps for change around environmental issues.

I would like to thank our Board of Directors and Advisory Board Members for their ongoing commitment to and support of the Foundation's work, and the work of the hundreds of nonprofit organizations that make life better for the residents, workers and visitors of DC and the region. I would also like to thank the staff of the Foundation for their continued dedication and ongoing assistance to the organizations in this report and with those past or not yet funded in the DC region. Your work builds a stronger community and a better place for all.

The Morris and Gwendolyn Cafritz Foundation was incorporated under the laws of the District of Columbia in 1948. The Foundation awards grants only to charitable, educational and cultural institutions exempt from taxation under the Internal Revenue Code. The general policy is to concentrate grants to organizations operating within the Greater Washington Metropolitan Area, with projects of direct assistance to the District of Columbia and its environs. Grants generally are not made for capital purposes, endowments or to individuals. Support for projects will be limited as to time, and it is not the general policy to commit for more than one year at a time.
